

# Grubmaster's Meal Competition: **One Pot Weekend**

## Teaching Goals

- Scouts think about and compare various types of cookware
- Encourage resourcefulness and variety of planning with limited supplies
- Encourage even sharing of cooking and clean up duties

## Before the trip

- Patrol leader requisitions one "pot". Any single piece of cookware is acceptable, as long as it's just one piece. It can, for example, be a griddle or a sauce pan or a soup pot or a dutch oven or a grill.
- Menus are approved by the grubmaster.

## Judging

- A scorecard is maintained by each patrol leader for the weekend and handed to the senior patrol leader at the end of the trip
- The Big Kahuna patrol will act as judges and score patrols, but is otherwise not included in the competition.
- 10 points for each meal prepared using the patrol's 'pot'.
  - Meals made without the pot get zero points
  - If the meal and a separate dessert at that same meal are cooked in the same pot, 20 points are earned for the meal
- Each patrol receives bonus points
  - 6 points for each meal where the cooking area is kept clean and orderly before, during, and after the meal.
  - 4 points for each meal that includes each of the 4 basic food groups
- 15 points if no scout repeats a job over the weekend (cooking, clean up, water, firewood, latrine)
- 10 thrifty bonus points if the menu is under \$7.00 per person for lunch, dinner, and breakfast.
- Final award decision will be made by the Scoutmaster

## Award

The patrol with the highest score is invited to a dessert prepared by the Big Kahuna patrol at a future campout
